Did Shatner Finance Raid Into Laos?

Four American soldiers of fortune who led a secret mission into Laos last November were apparently financed in part by William Shatner, star of ABC's *T.J. Hooker*. The mission, designed to rescue American POWs, did not succeed and, in fact, resulted in the death of a Laotian guerrilla who was assisting the team.

Shatner paid the leader of the mission, James "Bo" Gritz, \$10,000, ostensibly as an option on his life story for a TV-movie. Gritz, 44, is a former lieutenant colonel in the Green Berets. He is said to have raised some \$45,000 for the raid, of which \$30,000 reportedly came from Clint Eastwood.

A spokesman for the Justice Department says the matter is "under investigation" to determine whether Gritz violated the U.S. Neutrality Act by mounting an armed expedition against a friendly country, Laos. Under the act, financing such an expedition is also illegal. Violators can

be fined \$3000 and imprisoned for three years.

Shatner says that he met Gritz on the *Hooker* set several months ago and "became enthralled" with his life story. He paid Gritz \$10,000 as part of a development deal he has with Paramount Pictures. "What he was going to do with the money was none of my business," Shatner says.

Jay Bernstein, Shatner's manager, says that Shatner was aware of Gritz's efforts to rescue MIAs, but denies that Shatner knowingly financed a military action. "Bill's interest is in this man's great story," Bernstein says. "We were looking for an ending."

Shatner has done a public service TV spot for the National League of Families of American Prisoners and Missing in Southeast Asia. Carol Bates, the group's director of public affairs says that Gritz's efforts are unlikely to be successful because "they are always surrounded by publicity." She calls his missions "foolish" and says they "could frustrate legitimate efforts" to have the servicemen returned.

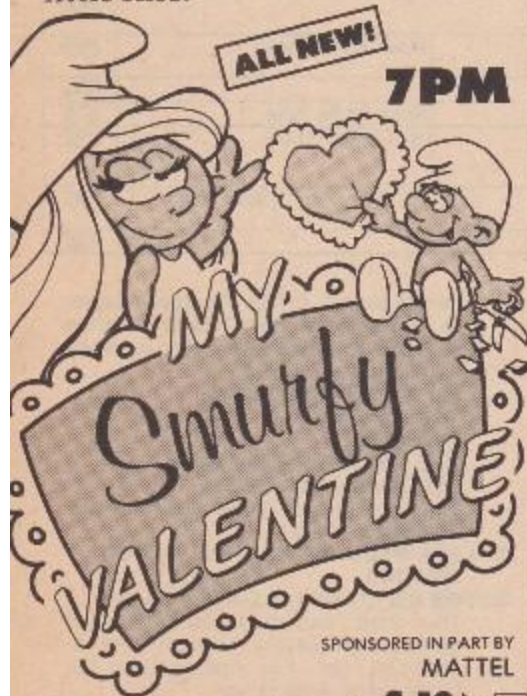

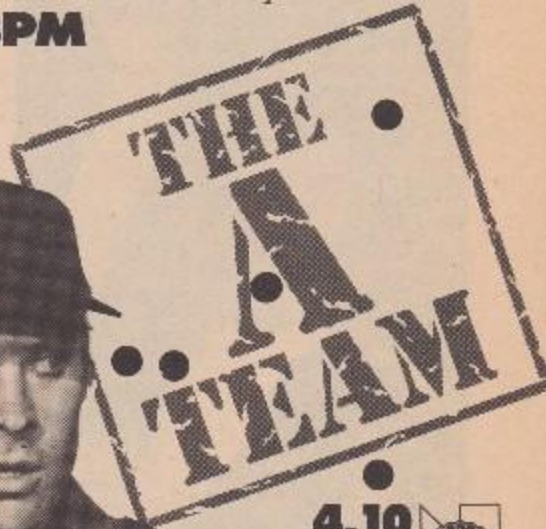
